DISCLAIMER

RISK STATEMENT – SAILING ON CRANSLEY RESERVIOUR

It must be recognised that sailing is by its nature is an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By going out on the water you agree and acknowledge that:

- (i) You are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and you accept responsibility exposing yourself to such inherent risk ;
- (ii) You will comply at all times with the rules of Cransley SC, failure to do so may result in your membership of the club being withdrawn.
- (iii) You must wear a buoyancy aid whilst on the water, in the duty hut and on the pontoon
- (iv) You must wear sailing clothing suitable for the time of year and weather conditions, wearing t-shirt and shorts and no footwear in March, April, May, October and November is not acceptable. Sailors should wear at very least a wet suit and footwear and it is suggested that sailors also wear a spray top/jacket in some weather conditions. Cold water shock is a killer so do not put yourself at risk;
- (v) You accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by your own negligence;
- (vi) You will not participate in sailing activities whilst your ability to skipper or crew a dinghy is impaired by alcohol, drugs or whilst otherwise unfit to participate ;
- (vii) The provision of safety boat cover is limited to such assistance, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- (viii) A responsible adult is responsible for ensuring that youths under the age of 18 are fully aware of the above.

CLUB BOATS

Before taking a club boat out on the water please book the boat out using the iPad. Put your name i.e. Joe Bloggs and the boat you are taking out i.e. Hansa.

Please put your boat fee in the brown envelope and write on the envelope your name, date and boat taken out and put the envelope with the money in the boat donations box.

Please report any damage or if anything is missing from the boat to a member of the committee and write in the book by the iPad what is missing/damage and to what boat.

Please treat club boats as if they were your own and if you are unsure how to rig the boat correctly please ask someone to assist you to avoid damage to the boat.

After sailing please make sure you put the sail, rudder and tiller back into the appropriate container
