1 RULES

1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*. Competitors should note that Cransley Sailing club and the Comet Class Association implement the RYA Racing Charter and that they will be required to undertake to sail in compliance with the Charter, which can be found at the front of the RYA rule book (Racing Rules of Sailing 2013-2016).

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

2.1 The regatta is open to boats of the Comet Duo class

2.3 Late entries will be accepted under the following conditions:

Late entries will be accepted during registration on Saturday 9th July 2016.

2.4 The following restrictions on the number of boats apply.

Entry will be limited to the first 50 boats to enter.

Thereafter £15 late entry is only available at registration on Saturday 9th July 2016

3.2 Other fees: after sailing. The Galley will be selling breakfast bacon rolls from 9.30am and a hot lunch.

7.1 The Low Point System of Appendix A will apply with A9 replacing A4.2.

8 NOMINATION OF RIG

A competitor shall use the same type of rig for all races.

9 STATEMENT OF RISK

Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone." Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that: They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event; They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore; They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions; Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate; The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities; The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.

10 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3 million per event or the equivalent.
